PARENTS PAGE: PREPARING FOR CAMP



TRAVEL & CAMPER SPENDING:

By this point, you should have completed and returned your Camper Travel Form. We must know how each child is arriving at camp. We will be sending an email home with specific bus and flight information during the first week of June that will help you prepare for the first day of camp.

Also, please make sure you've put a little money in your camper's spending account. You'll find this in your MyCampManager account on the main page under the 'View Camper Spending' heading. (It is near the bottom of your main page menu.)



FORMS:

The Activity Preference, Camper Profile, & Bunk Request Forms should all be complete at this time. Health, Insurance, and Authorization Forms should be completed by **June 1st**. We have marked all forms in our system as 'completed' to date. If your MyCampManager account shows missing forms, please call the office to let us know when to expect them. **Please note:** The Additional Options should be completed only by families who want Hebrew lessons.

CLOTHING AND PACKING:

By this time, all US families should have contacted Camp Trucking (www.camptrucking.com or 970.949.0690) to arrange for your child's bags to be transported to camp. All baggage must arrive to camp by June 18th for Tribal and Super Six and July 15th for Olympic Session. Camper for a Week participants should bring their luggage to camp with them. **Make sure to leave a blue or white camp shirt out to wear for the first day of camp this summer. Campers flying to camp should wear a blue Weequahic t-shirt.**



TICK PREVENTION:

While we will ensure our campers use repellents whenever necessary, we will also be professionally treating the grounds before camp, for further peace of mind. It never hurts to go over how to self-check for ticks with your camper as well!



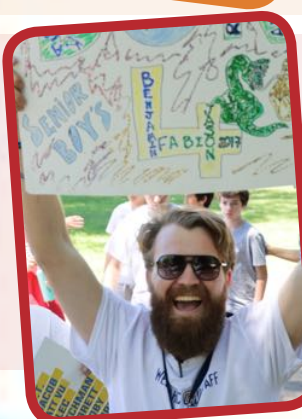
PERSONAL CONTACT INFORMATION & CONTACTING CAMP:

CAMP TRADITIONS

CAMPFIRE:

Campfire is an all camp event that happens every Friday evening. Following free play, our campers and staff all put on a white shirt and head to the lake. We start by offering two ten-minute services: a Shabbat and a Non-Denominational service. You can choose whichever you'd like but you do have to attend one of them.



Following the services, we light a big campfire and Camp Director Cole spends a few moments talking about CW's core values: **Gratitude, Attitude** and **Courage**. Then, Cole will introduce Kate (his much smarter and better looking co-director), who will lead the weekly awards ceremony that always ends in laughs due to the Prize Wheel.

TAPS & ALMA MATER:

Taps and Alma Mater are two songs that are sung right before we dismiss from an 'all camp' evening activity. It's a pretty special thing for the entire camp sing all at once! To start, everyone faces the lake, we put our arms around the people next to us, and then we sing with a little sway to the right and left. The melodies are easy to catch on to. We can't wait for your voice to join everyone else's at CW!
